

Divided into three parts:

Waiting for the Kingdom - Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Judah and Tamar, Perez, Hezron, Ram, Amminadab, Nahshon, Salmon and Rahab, Boaz and Ruth, Obed, Jesse, David and Bathsheba

The Kingdom - Solomon, Rehoboam, Abijah, Asa, Jehoshaphat, Jehoram, Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, Hezekiah, Manasseh, Amon, Josiah, Jeconiah

Waiting for the re-established kingdom - Jeconiah, Shealtiel, Zerubbabel, Abihud, Eliakim, Azor, Zadok, Achim, Elihud, Eleazar, Matthan, Jacob, Joseph, Jesus

Items of note: Starts from Abraham, traces line to Judah to establish royal bloodline, Judah and Tamar (a soap opera), Salmon and Rahab (the prostitute in Jericho), Boaz and Ruth (the Moabite), David and Bathsheba (Uriah's wife). The Kingdom – all kings of Judah. Jeconiah appears twice (was last king before exile, then was part of exile) Zerubbabel (governor of Jerusalem after the return)



Items of Note: Starts from Adam instead of Abraham, traces Mary's line to establish Son of God, more thorough genealogy than Matthew, includes 4 generations born in captivity, Methuselah (oldest recorded age), Shem (the Semetic race), Translating, instead of transliterating the first 10 generations from Adam to Noah yields: Man (is), Appointed, Mortal, Sorrow (but), The Blessed God, Shall come down, Teaching, His death shall bring, The despairing, Comfort and rest





Summary of Gospels

The Old Testament is the inspired introduction to the New Testament which foretells of the Person, work and kingdom of Christ. Old Testament quotes, allusions, and types are woven into the Gospels. The very first verse of the New Testament refers back to the Old Testament. (Matt 1:1 *The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham.*)

Jesus on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:27, 44, "And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself... Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled").

Summary of Gospels

Christ is presented as King (who rules over all things), prophet (who represents God to the Church) and priest (who intercedes for the Church). All the gospels record:

- (1) there is revealed one unique Person.
- (2) the ministry of John the Baptist.
- (3) the feeding of the 5,000.
- (4) Jesus riding on a donkey in fulfillment of Zechariah 9:9
- (5) the betrayal by Judas; the denial by Peter.
- (6) the trial and crucifixion of Christ.
- (7) the bodily resurrection of Christ.
- (8) events occurring during the forty days of the post-resurrection ministry of Christ
- (9) point forward to His second coming.



Biblical Eras of New Testament Summary of NT Era of the Church Era of Church

Jesus' ministry was primarily to the Jews. After Pentecost, the church expanded, primarily through the Jewish community. For nearly 14 years the focus was on expanding the church through the Jewish community, but God intervened twice to refocus the church expansion to include the Gentiles. In the first case, through visions, God arranged a meeting between the apostle Peter and a centurion named Cornelius. In the second case, God called someone who was a persecutor of the church, Saul, to be an apostle to the Gentiles. In a church council, the church confirmed that Gentiles did not have to become Jews in order to follow Christ. James, acting as the leader of the council, quoted Amos 9:11-14, to confirm the ministry to the Gentiles.




Although the fate of many of the apostles is uncertain, according to the information we have, some of them seem to have travelled a bit. Peter to Rome, Andrew in the Greek city of Patras, James in Jerusalem, John in Ephesus, Philip in the Greek city of Hierapolis, Bartholomew and Thomas in India, Matthew in Ethiopia, James of Alphaeus in Egypt.
